ORDER

The above named complainant, a person with 50% cerebral palsy filed a complaint dated 10.07.2014 under the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995, hereinafter referred to as the Act, regarding permission to use Lap Top/Computer (using Microsoft Word) to write Civil Services Main Examination and all other descriptive Examinations conducted by the respondent no. 1.

2. The complainant submitted that due to severe writing problem, he requested UPSC to allow him to use Lap Top/Computer with Microsoft Word to write Civil Services Main Examination and all other descriptive Examinations conducted by UPSC.

3. The matter was taken up with the respondent no. 1 and respondent no. 2 under Section 59 of

the Act vide letters dated 17.12.2014, 24.03.2015, 07.07.2015 and 16.10.2015 respectively.

The Respondent No.1 vide their letter no. 22/10/2011-E.(B) dated 10.02.2015 inter-alia

intimated that UPSC conducts examinations on the basis of rules notified by the Government that

contain various provisions specific to physically challenged categories and has requested DoP&T to

examine the matter on priority basis and communicate the decision taken to the complainant under

intimation to this Court.

5. The matter was heard during the hearing held on 21.07.2016. After hearing the parties and

considering the request made by the Department of Personnel & Training vide letter No.

22012/16/2016-AIS-I dated 20.07.2016, the Court agreed to the request made by the DoP&T and the

case was adjourned for hearing on 08.09.2016.

6. During the hearing on 08.09.2016 the Learned Counsel appearing on behalf of Respondent

No.1 submitted that there is a provision for using the scribe in the examinations conducted by the

UPSC. The UPSC is providing the facility of scribe and the candidates appearing in the examination

can avail the facility of their own scribe. Extra time of 20 minutes per hour is also being provided. The

Learned Counsel further submitted that UPSC is an examination conducting agency in accordance

with the rules of examination as notified by the Cadre Controlling Authority, i.e. Ministry of Personnel,

Public Grievances and Pensions and the case was re-scheduled for hearing on 21.10.2016.

7. During the hearing on 21.10,2016 no one appeared on behalf of the complainant and

respondents and therefore, the case was re-scheduled for hearing on 23.12.2016. The complainant

vide letter dated 15.10.2016 submitted that he appeared before the court for the first hearing held on

21.07.2016 along with his father. During that hearing he had requested orally before court to exempt

him from appearing in the hearings due to his physical conditions and the health problem of his father.

The complainant and the respondent no. 2 were not present during the hearing on 23.12.2016.

During the hearing the respondent no.1 submitted that it is beyond the domain of UPSC for providing

additional facilities to the candidates appearing in examinations. Only DoP&T has the power to do the

same.

- 9. The Court informed that Examination Guidelines of Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment is already under revision and advised DoP&T and U.P.S.C to provide their versions to the Committee for deliberations and action. The court assured that the matter will be referred by this Court to DoP&T and to Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment for their consideration.
- 10. The case is disposed off accordingly.
