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Introduction

1.1 The Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016

The Government enacted the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 as passed by the Parliament in December, 2016. The Act was brought into force from 19.04.2017. In the new RPwD Act, 2016, the numbers of disabilities have been revised from existing 7 to 21 and also reservation has been revised from 3% to 4% in government jobs for certain process or class of persons with benchmark disability. Every child with benchmark disability between the age group of 6 to 18 years shall have the right to free education. The Act provides for penalties for offences committed against PwDs, designated Special Courts have been proposed to handle cases relating to violation of Rights of PwDs.

1.2 Salient features of the RPwD Act 2016:

- 1) Responsibility has been cast upon the appropriate governments to take effective measures to ensure that the persons with disabilities enjoy their rights equally with others.
- 2) Disability has been defined based on an evolving and dynamic concept.
- 3) The RPwD Act covers the following specified disabilities:
 1. **Physical Disability:**
 - a) **Locomotor Disability:**
 - i) Leprosy Cured Person
 - ii) Cerebral Palsy
 - iii) Dwarfism
 - iv) Muscular Dystrophy
 - v) Acid Attack Victims
 - b) **Visual Impairment:**
 - i) Blindness
 - ii) Low Vision
 - c) **Hearing Impairment:**
 - i) Deaf
 - ii) Hard of Hearing
 - d) **Speech and Language Disability:**
 2. **Intellectual Disability**
 - a. Specific Learning Disabilities
 - b. Autism Spectrum Disorder

3. Mental Behaviour (Mental Illness)

4. Disability caused due to-

- a) Chronic Neurological Conditions such as-
 - i) Multiple Sclerosis
 - ii) Parkinson's Disease
- b) Blood Disorder-
 - i) Haemophilia
 - ii) Thalassemia
 - iii) Sickle Cell Disease

5. Multiple Disabilities

- 4) Additional benefits have been provided for persons with benchmark disabilities and those with high support needs.
- 5) Every child with benchmark disability between the age group of 6 and 18 years shall have the right to free education.
- 6) 5% reservation of seats in Government and Government aided higher educational institutions for persons with benchmark disabilities.
- 7) Stress has been given to ensure accessibility in public buildings (both Government and private) in a prescribed time-frame.
- 8) 4% reservation in Government jobs for certain persons or class of persons with benchmark disability.
- 9) The Act provides for grant of guardianship by District Court or any authority designated by the State Government under which there will be joint decision – making between the guardian and the persons with disabilities.
- 10) Broad based Central & State Advisory Boards on Disability to be set up as policy making bodies.
- 11) The Act provides for strengthening of the Office of Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities and State Commissioners of Disabilities which will act as regulatory bodies and Grievance Redressal agencies and also monitor implementation of the Act. These Offices will be assisted by an Advisory Committee comprising of experts in various disabilities.
- 12) Creation of National and State Fund to provide financial support to the persons with disabilities.
- 13) The Act provides for penalties for offences committed against persons with disabilities.
- 14) Designated Special Courts to handle cases concerning violation of rights of PwDs.

1.3 Population of Persons with Disabilities

As per census 2011, the population of persons with various disabilities is 268.10 Lakhs. This is the first time when broad categories of disabilities were included during enumeration. A total of eight types of disabilities were included in 2011 Census against the earlier five. The disability wise population is as under:


CCPD/SCPD for Persons with Disabilities

2.1 Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (CCPD):-

The Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 provides for appointment of a Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities at the Centre and two Commissioners to assist the Chief Commissioner, of which one Commissioner shall be a Person with Disability. The Chief Commissioner can take steps to safeguard the Rights of Persons with Disabilities and monitor the implementation of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016. The Chief Commissioner is appointed by the Central Government under Section 74 (1) of the RPwD Act, 2016

2.2 Office of the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (CCPD):

Office of the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities came into existence with the appointment of the first Chief Commissioner on 01.09.1998. The organization chart of the Office of CCPD is as under:-



2.3 Functions of the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (CCPD):

2.3.1 Under Section 75 (1), The Chief Commissioner shall:-

- (a) identify, suo motu or otherwise, the provisions of any law or policy, programme and procedures, which are inconsistent with this Act and recommend necessary corrective steps;
 - (b) inquire, suo motu or otherwise, deprivation of rights of persons with disabilities and safeguards available to them in respect of matters for which the Central Govt. is the appropriate Government and take up the matter with appropriate authorities for corrective action;
 - (c) review the safeguards provided by or under this Act or any other law for the time being in force for the protection of rights of persons with disabilities and recommend measures for their effective implementation;
 - (d) review the factors that inhibit the enjoyment of rights of persons with disabilities and recommend appropriate remedial measures;
 - (e) study treaties and other international instruments on the rights of persons with disabilities and make recommendations for their effective implementation;
 - (f) undertake and promote research in the field of the rights of persons with disabilities;
 - (g) promote awareness of the rights of persons with disabilities and the safeguards available for their protection;
 - (h) monitor implementation of the provisions of this Act and schemes, programmes meant for persons with disabilities;
 - (i) monitor utilisation of funds disbursed by the Central Government for the benefit of persons with disabilities; and
 - (j) perform such other functions as the Central Government may assign.
- (2) The Chief Commissioner shall consult the Commissioners on any matter while discharging its functions under this Act.

2.3.2 Whenever the Chief Commissioner makes a recommendation to an authority in pursuance of clause (b) of section 75, that authority shall take necessary action on it, and inform the Chief Commissioner of the action taken within three months from the date of receipt of the recommendation:

Provided that where an authority does not accept a recommendation, it shall convey reasons for non-acceptance to the Chief Commissioner within a period of three months, and shall also inform the aggrieved person.

2.4 State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (SCPDs):

The Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016 under section 79 (1) provides for appointment of a Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities in each State/UT for taking steps to safeguard and monitor the implementation of the RPwD Act, 2016. The Commissioner is appointed by the respective State Government/ UT under the provisions of Section 79 (1) of RPwD Act, 2016.

2.4.1 The State/UT Commissioner within the State shall:-

- (a) identify, suo motu or otherwise, provision of any law or policy, programme and procedures, which are inconsistent with this Act, and recommend necessary corrective steps;
- (b) inquire, suo motu or otherwise deprivation of rights of persons with disabilities and safeguards available to them in respect of matters for which the State Government is the appropriate Government and take up the matter with appropriate authorities for corrective action;
- (c) review the safeguards provided by or under this Act or any other law for the time being in force for the protection of rights of persons with disabilities and recommend measures for their effective implementation;
- (d) review the factors that inhibit the enjoyment of rights of persons with disabilities and recommend appropriate remedial measures;
- (e) undertake and promote research in the field of the rights of persons with disabilities;
- (f) promote awareness of the rights of persons with disabilities and the safeguards available for their protection;
- (g) monitor implementation of the provisions of this Act and schemes, programmes meant for persons with disabilities;
- (h) monitor utilisation of funds disbursed by the State Government for the benefits of persons with disabilities; and
- (i) perform such other functions as the State Government may assign.

2.4.2 Section 81 provides that, whenever the State Commissioner makes a recommendation to an authority in pursuance of clause (b) Section 80, that authority shall take necessary action on it, and inform the State Commissioner of the action taken within three months from the date of receipt of the recommendation:

Provided that where an authority does not accept a recommendation, it shall convey reasons for non-acceptance to the State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities within the period of three months, and shall also inform the aggrieved person.

2.5 Powers of CCPD:

2.5.1 Powers of Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (CCPD):

Section 77 (1): The Chief Commissioner shall, for the purpose of discharging his functions under this Act, have the same powers of a civil court as are vested in a court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 while trying a suit, in respect of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) summoning and enforcing the attendance of witnesses;
- (b) requiring the discovery and production of any documents;
- (c) requisitioning any public record or copy thereof from any court or office;
- (d) receiving evidence on affidavits; and
- (e) issuing commissions for the examination of witnesses or documents.

- (2) Every proceeding before the Chief Commissioner shall be a judicial proceeding within the meaning of sections 193 and 228 of the Indian Penal Code and the Chief Commissioner shall be deemed to be a civil court for the purposes of section 195 and Chapter XXVI of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.

2.5.2 Powers of State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (SCPDs)

Under Section 82. (1):- The State Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (SCPDs) shall, for the purpose of discharging their functions under this Act, have the same powers of a civil court as are vested in a court under the Code of Civil Procedure, 1908 while trying a suit, in respect of the following matters, namely:—

- (a) summoning and enforcing the attendance of witnesses;
 - (b) requiring the discovery and production of any documents;
 - (c) requisitioning any public record or copy thereof from any court or office;
 - (d) receiving evidence on affidavits; and
 - (e) issuing commissions for the examination of witnesses or documents.
- (2) Every proceeding before the State Commissioner shall be a judicial proceeding within the meaning of sections 193 and 228 of the Indian Penal Code and the State Commissioners shall be deemed to be a civil court for the purposes of section 195 and Chapter XXVI of the Code of Criminal Procedure, 1973.

2.6 Brief on the Areas of Intervention by the Office of CCPD:

- 2.6.1** A large number of persons with disabilities approach O/o CCPD whenever they are deprived of their rights by any Govt. body, not only for matters relating to the Central Government but also to various State Governments and local authorities and also private entities.
- 2.6.2** The O/o CCPD takes suo-motu notices of non-implementation of various provisions of the Act such as reservation in employment, admissions, instances of discrimination against PwDs reported in the press, media in appropriate portrayal of disability by electronic media and takes up with the concerned authorities. Such proactive initiatives have not only protected the rights of PwDs but also sensitized all the stakeholders and created awareness about the issues concerning PwDs.
- 2.6.3** The O/o CCPD inspects the organizations that are given grant-in-aid by Government of India under various schemes like ADIP, DDRS, etc. with a view to monitoring the utilization of funds. Physical verification of the beneficiaries is ensured in the process.
- 2.6.4** One of the major areas of intervention by the O/o CCPD is to gather information about the progress of implementation of various schemes, programmes and the provisions of the Act by different departments of Central/State/UT Governments through meetings and interactions.
- 2.6.5** The O/o CCPD takes initiative to audit and inspect public places such as Government office buildings, hospitals, stadium, market places, railway stations, airports, bus stops, religious places, etc. for their accessibility to PwDs and ensures that the required modifications are carried out.

CHAPTER 3

Status of Implementation of the RPwD Act, 2016 by Central Ministries/Departments

The Office of Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities has been constantly pursuing with Central Ministries and Departments for the implementation of the provisions of RPwD Act by them and for adding separate chapter in their respective Annual Reports highlighting the actions taken for the benefit of Persons with Disabilities.

The status of implementation of major provisions of the Act and facilities being extended to PwDs by Central Ministries & Departments are highlighted below:

3.2 Department of Water Resources, River Development & Ganga Rejuvenation, Ministry of Jal Shakti

Campaign is being fully complied by this Department and also been circulated to the Organizations under this Department for adherence.

A separate chapter for the policy decisions and activities undertaken for the benefit of the Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan) has been included in the Annual Report of the Department of Water Resources, RD & GR since 2006-07.

This Department is mainly engaged in providing technical and financial assistance to State Governments for completion of their water resources projects. However a special mention on relevant information of this Department may be seen at page no.215 (Chapter-15 : Appointments of persons with special needs and page no. 220 (Staff in position) of Department's Annual Report 2021-22 is as under.

3.4 Department of Expenditure, Arun Jately National Institute of Financial Management, Faridabad

Over the period the Institute has started long Term Courses in Financial Management, Finance and Government Accounting and Internal Audit. The institute also conducts a variety of management development term programs 03 days to 03 month duration. The participants include officers from Central Government, Sate Government, Defence & Para – Military Forces, PSE, automonuuous bodies and students from open market.

In order to cater the needs of all varieties of participants / students, the institute has 12 class rooms, conferecnce room, Meeting Room, Auditorium. Sports Complex and 03 hostels. All the buildings are equipped with retrohiting having provision of wheelchair ramp and railing at their entrance, disabled friendly toilets, lifts etc. whenever disabled participants are nominated for training programs they are given accommodation at ground floors. In case any participant is accompanied by helper then institute provides him/her a suitable accommodation so as to accommodate helper with the participant.

In all the institute has a disabled friendly environment and it abides by all relevant provisions of RPwD Act, 2016.

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3.8 Ministry of Steel

The Ministry of Steel follows the Government's rules with regard to the implementation of The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (RPwD Act). As on December 31, 2021, five persons [one hearing handicapped (HH), one visually handicapped (VH) and three orthopaedically handicapped (OH)] with disabilities are employed in the Ministry of Steel.

3.8.1 Steel Authority of India Ltd. (SAIL)

Provisions related to reservation for Persons with Disabilities in terms of RPwD Act is followed at Plants/ units of SAIL.

Continuous efforts are/have been made for barrier free environment at work place for persons with disabilities.

SAIL extends free medical facility even to non-entitled brother or sister of an employee, if they are disabled and dependent on the employee.

Various facilities for sports and cultural activities are provided exclusively for the disabled persons at plant locations. Separate play grounds have been earmarked for the handicapped at some of the plant locations.

SAIL provides scholarship to the physically disabled children of its employees to support their education.

Special relaxation is provided in allotment of quarters to disabled employees. Care is taken to allot ground floor to such employees.

3.8.2 Rashtriya Ispat Nigam Ltd. (RINL)

- RINL is earmarking stipulated percentage of posts in Group-A, B and C as per RPwD Act. As per the Act, RINL has been implementing reservation whenever recruitment is taken up. Concessions and relaxations are extended to PwDs like Upper Age Limit (10 years), Application fee Exemption, 10% relaxation in Qualification marks at par with SC/ST, 10% relaxation in marks in Selection Tests at par with SC/ST.
- Since the Act came into force, RINL has employed 214 persons with various disabilities (excluding 10 persons on merit).
- Facilities provided as per statute include identification of jobs, post recruitment, and pre-promotion training, providing aids/assistive devices, accessibility and barrier free environment at work place, preference in allotment of company's quarters, grievance redressal, Liaison Officer appointed for matters relating to Persons with Disabilities, Special Casual Leave and preference in transfer/posting.
- Providing Ramp Way, Auditory Signal in the lifts of the building, Provision of a wheel-chair at the Reception Centre are some of actions taken up for the convenience of the differently-abled persons at different offices at main administrative building / corporate office.

3.8.3 NMDC Ltd.

NMDC, being a mining organization, is governed by the provisions of the Mines Act and Rules and Regulations there of Considering the safety factor, it is not possible to employ PwDs in jobs involving working in the mines/plant. However, efforts are being made to induct PwDs in posts where field work is not involved and at present NMDC has 100 employees with disabilities in various posts.

NMDC has taken several steps for convenience of differently enabled persons visiting the Offices of the Company like providing ramp way, auditory signal in the lifts etc. Employees in the Projects who become disabled while in service are redeployed in identified posts.

3.8.4 MOIL Ltd.

- At work place, employees have been provided welfare facilities for improving their service conditions, quality of life and social security.
- Therefore, facilities in line with Persons with Disabilities Act 1995 i.e Lift/Elevators, Toilets, Drinking Water, Wheel Chair, Crutches, Range of reach, Path/Walk, Physically handicapped allowance etc. have been provided for the Divyang employees.
- The manner of selection of persons with disabilities for various posts: Recruitment for identified posts for persons with disabilities is carried out Reservation, relaxation and concessions provided to persons with benchmark disability as per Govt. of India directives/ instructions, are followed.
- Preference in Transfer and Posting: As far as possible, the persons with disabilities is exempted from the rotational transfer policy/transfer.
- Preference in allotment of Residential accommodation/Guest House: MOIL gives preference to the person with disabilities for providing them accessible accommodation in company's township.

3.8.5 MECON Ltd.

MECON has implemented the provisions of RPwD Act. Total employment strength of MECON as on 31.12.2021 is 1138, out of which persons belonging to disabled / physically handicapped category in various posts is 10. In view of the Government's policy for 'Divyang' persons, the Company's website has been made user friendly for visually impaired by installing Screen Reader Technology. For the convenience of the Divyang persons, ramp is provided for entering into the office premises.

3.8.6 MSTC Ltd.

As on 31st December, 2021, MSTC has 09 employees who are persons with disabilities or Divyang.

3.8.7 KIOCL Ltd.

As on 31st December, 2021, KIOCL has 11 employees who are persons with Disabilities or Divyang.

3.8.8 Ferro Scrap Nigam Ltd. (FSNL)

FSNL is a service organization, rendering its specialized services to the customer plants in scrap management & allied jobs. FSNL carries out its operational activities in open area in all the seasons. The Heavy Earthmoving Equipments like Balling Cranes, Magnetic Separators, Dozers, Dumpers etc. are used by FSNL for carrying out the operational activities. Therefore, the atmosphere/working conditions of FSNL is not conducive for the persons with disabilities and hence their engagement for such field jobs is not

safe. However, adhering to the Government directives, FSNL has identified three posts each in Executive & Non-executive categories for persons with disabilities, one each for Visually Handicapped (VH), Hearing Handicapped (HH) and Orthopaedically Handicapped (OH) under Group-A & Group-C categories. Besides, company's website has been made user friendly for visually impaired by installing Screen Reader Technology. Ramp and railings have been provided in office premises and specially modified/compatible toilets have been provided.

3.11 Central Sanskrit University

Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan, was established by the Govt. of india in the year 1970 as per the recommendations of Sanskrit Commission 1956. Its main aim & objective was to promote, propagate and preserve Sanskrit learning, teaching and research throughout the country. It was fully funded by the Ministry of HRD (now Ministry of Education), Govt. of India. Considering its contribution in the field

of promotion and propagation of traditional Sanskrit education, the Govt. of India accorded it the status of Deemed to be University w.e.f. 7th May, 2002. The erstwhile Rashtriya Sanskrit Sansthan (Deemed to be University w.e.f. 7th May 2020 (No. 5 of 2020) passed by the Parliament and assented to be his Excellency, the President of India and started functioning as the Central Sanskrit University, Delhi since 30th April, 2020. With its Headquarters at New Delhi, it has twelve campuses spread across the country. All 12 Campuses and Headquarters Office of University are built up-disabled friendly. In addition to these constituent campuses, it has granted affiliation to 58 Sanskrit institutions established in different regions of the country.

- i) The Headquarters office as well as its Campuses are barrier free environment for persons with disabilities in physical environment. The amenities like entrance, ramps, drinking water facility, toilets, lifts, special wheel chairs, Braille and audio guide facility etc. are available which are accessible to the persons with disability.
- ii) The University is conducting courses from Pre-Matric to Post Graduation and Vidya Varidhi (Ph.D) courses in Sanskrit. The admission in the University are open to all irrespective of religion, caste, creed, category, geographical area etc. During 2021-22, a total number of 162 students belonging to PwBD category appeared for examinations of different courses. PwBD students were exempted from the examination fees on producing relevant mandatory certificate.
- iii) University is providing Merit Scholarships to the students studying Sanskrit/Pali/Prakrit Language in Pre-Matric to Post Graduation and Vidyavaridhi (Ph.D) courses, under the schemes for Sanskrit promotions. During 2021-22, a no. of 27 students under PwBD category are benefitted with these scholarships in different courses of studies.
- iv) Budget allocated for PwBD students during 2021-22 was Rs. 156.00 lakhs and expenditure incurred during this period was Rs. 155.39 lakhs.
- v) The Govt. has enacted the Rights of Persons with Disabilities (RPwD) Act, 2016, which came into force on 19.04.2017. Section 34 of the said Act provides for not less than 4% reservation in vacancies for categories of persons with benchmark disabilities (disability of 40% or more). The CSU implemented the provision of reservation in vacancies under the RPwD Act, 2016. Copy of the Act has been circulated to the Campuses in time. Presently, there are 02 Associate Professors, 05 Assistant Professors, 01 Professional Assistant, 02 LDCs and 03 MTS who belong to PwBD category are appointed in Headquarter office and Campuses of the University. Separate Rosters are also maintained for PwBD reservation recruitment in Teaching/Non teaching staff, as per rules.
In addition, as per provision, PwBD candidates are given following exemption/relaxation and facilities in recruitment process:
 - i) Such candidates are charged a lower amount of Rs. 500 as processing fees in Recruitment, compared to Rs. 1000/- from non-exempted categories.
 - ii) Upper age limit relaxation of 10 years is given in addition to community wise age relaxation.
 - iii) They are also provided assistance of Scribes for appearing in recruitment examinations.
- vi) Besides above, the University has also appointed a Nodal Officer-Shri Sonraj Patidar, Section Officer, CSU, Headquarter Office, Janakpuri, New Delhi, entrusted with the responsibilities of maintaining records of representations/grievances relating to PwBD employees/students in CSU, New Delhi.
- vii) There is one PwBD Cell Constituted by the Competent Authority, comprising of five members. Dr. V.S.V. Bhaskar Reddy, Associate Professor (Shiksha Shastra), CSU, K.J. Somaiya Campus, Mumbai (Maharashtra) is the Chairman of the Committee.

- viii) University has duly constituted Anti-Discrimination Cell and it strictly follows the Govt. of India policy and monitoring concerned activities in its 12 Campuses of the University, spread all over the India. The officials/faculty members of University strictly adhere the instructions of Govt. of India and desist from any act of discrimination against SC/ST/PwBD students on grounds of their social origin. A page has already been developed in the website-www.sanskrit.nic.in for lodging such complaints of caste discrimination by SC/ST/PwBD students and also placed complaint registers in all Director officers in University's Campuses, for the purposes. University ensures that no official/faculty member of the Campuses indulged in any kind of discrimination against any community or category of students.

Caring for Persons with Disability

Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, Mahatma Gandhi NREGA

Mahatma Gandhi NREGA is a demand driven scheme. Hance, separate earmarking of employment/resource: has not been provided for differently abled.

The disabled or differently-abled persons defined under the Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (1 of 196) as persons with disabilities, the severity of which is 40% and above are considered as special category of vulnerable persons for the purposes of Mahatma Gandhi NREGA. The disabled persons as defined in the National Trust for Welfare of Persons with Autism Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities Act, 1999 (44 of 1999) are also to be considered as disabled for the purpose of inclusion of Mahatma Gandhi NREGA.

To increase participation of Persons with Disabilities (PWD) in the Scheme, some major initiatives are being suggested such as:

- Special schedule of rates for PWDs.
- Identification of suitable works for PWDs.
- Organization of PWDs in groups.

As per the information uploaded by the States/UTs in Management Information System (MIS), during the year 2021-22 (till 31" December, 2021), a total of 5.27 lakh disabled beneficiaries have been provided employment who together generated 1.75 crore person days of work.

Deendayal Antyodaya Yojana-National Rural Livelihoods Mission (DAY-NRLM)

DAY-NRLM recognizes that poverty and disability are closely linked to each other and therefore it addresses specific needs of individuals as well as families of Persons with Disabilities (PWDs). The states undertake participatory vulnerability assessment processes as part of social mobilization. This entry point activity at the village level with a specific focus on identification of households of Persons with Disabilities (PWDs) shall ensure greater inclusion of these individuals and families into the DAY-NRLM network. The details regarding inclusion and capitalization of PWDs SHGs are as follows:

About Inclusive development of people with disabilities (PWDs)

Inclusive development of people with disabilities (PWDs) is one of the critical components of DAY-NRLM. This entails implementation of interventions that focus on community-integration of PWDs and their families. Under DAY-NRLM, priority is given to the promotion of exclusive SHGs of differently abled persons and their care givers. The initial social mobilization process lays great stress on including members of differently abled households in the SHG fold. The organization of PWDs into groups has led to increased awareness and accessing of entitlements and rights. DAY-NRLM also seeks to provide financial support in the form of Revolving Fund and Community Investment Fund to these SHGs on a priority basis. DAY-NRLM also provides scope for inclusion of minors through the adult parent or immediate caretaker of the minor as nominee.

It also provides 50% more fund allocation to the SHGs of PWD.

A draft advisory for deepening work with elderly and people with disability has been developed and it has been shared with the states. The work is being undertaken with the support of technical support agency HelpAge. States have been supported in incorporating the detailed activities in the plan 21-22 at least in two to four blocks.

- At present, the work is undertaken in States of MP, UP, Chhattisgarh, Rajasthan, Odisha, Assam, Tripura, Nagaland, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Arunachal Pradesh, Sikkim, HP, Punjab, Haryana and Uttarakhand in 51 districts and 100 blocks.
- Training of St anchor at SMMU, DMMU and BMWU from 2 to 4 blocks has taken place.
- Fifty staff from the states have been given training and exposure visit in HelpAge immersion sites in Cuddalore and 136 CRPS provided immersion training in HelpAge immersion sites of Tamilnadu, West Bengal and Bihar.
- The SRLMs would be provided hand holding support in inclusion of elderly and finances inclusion and livelihood interventions.
- Action Groups aimed at Social Reconstruction (AGRSAR) programme is being implemented by MOSJE and MORD and 15 SRLMs of Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Gujarat, Haryana, Himachal Pradesh, Jharkhand, Karnataka, Kerala, MP, Odisha, Sikkim, UP, Tamilnadu, Tripura, West Bengal and financial assistance has been released to 5000 groups. The programme focusses on inclusion of the elderly.

Deendayal Upadhyaya Grameen Kaushalya Yojana (DDU-GKY)

As per DDU-GKY guidelines, States have been mandated to ensure that at least 5% of beneficiaries in the skill training course being implemented in the state are from among persons with disabilities (PwD). In 2021-2022 (upto 31.12.2021), 131 PwD candidates have been trained under DDU-GKY projects.

Rural Self Employment Training Institutes (RSETIs)

Under RSETIs Scheme, during the year 2021-22 (upto 31.12.2021), 1,038 PwD candidates have been trained.

Pradhan Mantri Awaas Yojana-Gramin (PMAY-G)

The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 provides for social security for persons with disabilities. Accordingly, in the scheme of PMAY-G while deciding the inter-se priority among the beneficiaries who

are to be provided assistance, households with any disabled member and no able bodied adult member have been accorded additional deprivation score so that such households are given priority while allotting the houses. Keeping this in view, State should ensure that at least 5 % of beneficiaries are from among persons with disabilities.

In case where the beneficiary is old or a person with disability and is therefore not able to get the house constructed on his/her own, such houses, are taken up as a part of the Rural Manson Training (RMT) programme. In case there are still some beneficiaries left out, the State/UT Governments ensure that such beneficiaries are assisted through the Gram Panchayats or a ground level programme functionary to get their house constructed. As on 31st December, 2021, a total of 32,099 houses have been sanctioned for the physically and mentally disabled and out of which 26,669 houses have been completed.

Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY)

PMGSY is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme with the objective to provide access to the basic services through construction of all -weather roads to populations residing in the rural areas including Differently abled.

National Social Assistance Programme (NSAP)

In February, 2009, the Government approved Indira Gandhi National Disability Pension Scheme (IGNDPS) under NSAP for BPL households with severe or multiple disabilities between the age group of 18-64 years with assistance @200/- per month per beneficiary.

For the purpose of defining severe or multiple disabilities the following legal provisions are followed:

- a. As per Section 56(4) of the Persons with Disabilities Act, 1995 (PWD Act, 95), "persons with severe disability" means a person with 80% or more of one or more disabilities.
- b. As per Section 2(h) of the National Trust for the Welfare of Persons with Autism, Cerebral Palsy, Mental Retardation and Multiple Disabilities Act, 1999 (National Trust Act, 1999), "Multiple Disabilities "means combination of 2 or more disabilities.
- c. Steps are being taken to implement the Rights of Persons with Disability Act, 2016 for the NSAP schemes.

Consequent upon the lowering of age under Indira Gandhi National Old Age Pension Scheme (IGNOAPS), the upper age limit under IGNDPS has been lowered from 64 years to 59 years. With effect from 1.10.2012, the amount of pension under IGNDPS has been increased to Rs. 300/- per month and upper age limit has been increased to 79 years. After attaining the age of 80 years, the beneficiary would be shifted to IGNOAPS for getting pension of Rs. 500/-. The total number of beneficiaries under the scheme is 10.58 lakh.

3.16 Department of Pension & Pensioners Welfare

As far as Department of Pension & Pensioners Welfare is concerned, the input in this regards is furnished as under:-

- (i) The Department Pensions and Pensioners Welfare was set up in 1985 as part of the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions to formulate policy and coordination of matters relating to retirement benefits of Central Government employees. Being the nodal Department for pension and pension related matters, on reference received from other Ministries/Departments this Department renders advice on interpretation Pension Rules. As per the Allocation of Business Rules, the Department is responsible for:-

- Formulation of policy and coordination of matters relating to retirement benefits of Central Government employees,
 - Administration of Central Civil Service (Pension) Rules, 1972; the Central Civil Services (Commutation of Pension) Rules, 1981 and the Central Civil Services (Extraordinary Pension) Rules, 1939,
 - Matters relating to amendment to, or relaxation of Pension Rules; and
 - Policy and coordination relating to welfare of Central Government Pensioners.
- (ii) Decision on the matter with financial implication are subject to the concurrence of Ministry of Finance. Action in respect of other matters involving recurring financial implication by relaxation of liberalization of any rule of subject, to guidelines of agreed between Department of Pensions and Pensioners Welfare and the Ministry of Finance, Department of Expenditure.
- (iii) So far as this Department is concerned there was no separate budget provision made for persons with disabilities in FY 2021-22. Also there is no separate budget allocation for persons with disabilities in this Department. The annual report is also consolidated with Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions. The information in respect of points (ii) to (v) may be treated as Nil. The information in respect of point (vi) i.e. policy decisions and the activities undertaken by the Department are given as under:-
- (a) DoP&PW has notified CCS (Pension) Rules, 2021 in place of CCS (Pension) Rules, 1972. Provision for liberalised income criteria has been made in the CCS (Pension) Rules, 2021 in respect of child/children/siblings suffering from disability, for eligibility for grant of family pension for life, if his/her overall income, other than family pension, is less than the entitled family pension at ordinary rate i.e. 30% of the last pay drawn by the deceased Government servant/pensioner plus the Dearness Relief admissible thereon.
- (b) **Invalid Pension –**
39. Invalid pension.- (1) The case of a Government servant acquiring a disability, where the provisions of section 20 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) are applicable, shall be governed by the provisions of the said section:
- Provided that such employee shall produce a disability certificate from the competent authority as prescribed under the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017.
- (2) If a Government servant, in a case where the provisions of section 20 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) are not applicable, intends to retire from the service on account of any bodily or mental infirmity which permanently incapacitates him for the service, he may apply to the Head of Department for retirement on Invalid Pension:
- Provided that an application for invalid pension submitted by the spouse of the Government servant failing which by a member of the family of the Government servant may also be accepted, if the Head of Department is satisfied that the Government servant himself is not in a position to submit such application on account of the bodily or mental infirmity:
- Provided further that where a Government servant, who has acquired a disability and in whose case the provisions of section 20 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (49 of 2016) are applicable, intends to retire under this rule, the Government servant shall be advised that he has the option of continuing in service with the same pay scale and service benefits which he is otherwise entitled to and in case the Government servant does not withdraw his request for retirement under this rule, his request may be processed in accordance with the provisions of this rule.

- (3) On receipt of an application under sub-rule (2), the Head of Office or Head of Department shall, within fifteen days of the receipt of such application, request the concerned authority for examination of the Government servant, not later than thirty days from the date of receipt of such request by the following medical authority, namely:-
- (a) Medical Board in the case of a Gazetted Government servant and of a non-Gazetted Government servant whose pay, as defined in rule 9 (21) of the Fundamental Rules, 1922 exceeds fifty- four thousand rupees per month; and
 - (b) Civil Surgeon or a District Medical Officer or Medical Officer of equivalent status in other cases.
- (4) The medical authority shall also be supplied by the Head of the Office or Head of Department in which the applicant is employed with a statement of what appears from official records to be the age of the applicant, and if a service book is being maintained for the applicant, the age recorded therein should be reported and a copy of the letter requesting for examination by the medical authority shall be endorsed to the Government servant.
- (5) The Government servant shall appear before the concerned medical authority for medical examination on the date fixed by that authority and the medical authority shall examine the Government servant to ascertain whether or not the Government servant is fit for further service or whether he is fit for further service of less laborious character than that which he had been doing.
- (6) No medical certificate of incapacity for service may be granted unless the medical authority has received a request from the Head of his Office or Head of Department for medical examination of the Government servant.
- (7) A lady doctor shall be included as a member of the Medical Board when a woman candidate is to be examined.
- (8) Where the medical authority referred to in sub-rule (3) has found a Government servant mentioned in sub-rule (2) not fit for further service or has found him fit for further service of less laborious character than that which he had been doing, it shall issue a Medical Certificate in Format 6 and if the Government servant is found to be unfit for further service, he may be granted invalid pension in accordance with rule 44 not later than forty five days from the date of the receipt of medical certificate in Format 6.
- (9) A Government servant, who retires from service even before completing qualifying service of ten years, shall also be granted invalid pension and, in his case, the amount of pension shall also be calculated at fifty percent of emoluments or average emoluments, whichever is more beneficial to him in accordance with rule 44:
- Provided that in such cases the Government servant-
- (a) **Has been examined by the appropriate medical authority either before his appointment or after his appointment to the Government service and declared fit by such medical authority for Government service; and**
 - (b) **Fulfil all other conditions mentioned in this rule for grant of invalid pension.**
- (10) In case, the Government servant has been found to be fit for further service of less laborious character than that which he has been doing, he shall, if, he is willing to be so employed, be employed on lower post and if there be no means of employing him even on a lower post, he may be admitted to invalid pension.

REDRESSAL OF GRIEVANCES

- 4.1.1 Under Sections 75 and 76 of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 the Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (CCPD) is mandated to take steps to safeguard the rights and facilities made available to persons with disabilities and to redress their grievances related to the deprivation of their rights and non implementation of laws, rules bye-laws etc. made by the appropriate Government for their welfare.
- 4.1.2 The office of CCPD receives complaints that relate to a range of issues like non-implementation or wrong implementation of reservation in employment/education, unfair selection, promotion, transfers, denial of service benefits and other service related matters; denial of admission, improper infrastructure and facilities for education, writing of examinations, harassment, accessibility-related issues, denial of banking facilities, preferential allotment of land, etc. A large number of organizations and persons with disabilities also sought clarifications on various issues related to persons with disability. In case of violation of any provision of the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 or of any law, rules and regulations etc. made for the benefit of persons with disabilities, the office takes up the matter with the concerned authorities and resolves it either through conciliation/advice or quasi judicial proceedings that are concluded by passing orders with appropriate direction/advice to the concerned authorities.
- 4.1.3 The office has developed a comprehensive format of notice to show cause, which gives brief facts of the complaint, the position of law, the violation committed and also the course of remedial action by the respondent Organizations. This has helped in exercising the quasi-judicial powers vested with the CCPD for the redressal of grievances relating to the rights of persons with disabilities. The CCPD also on his own initiative registers complaints/cases against establishments, whose actions are in violation of statutory provisions and administrative arrangements meant for persons with disabilities.
- 4.1.4 Interventions of the office of CCPD have resulted in increased awareness and understanding about various provisions of the law, the responsibilities of the establishments, attitudinal and behavioral changes towards PwDs and about the mechanism for grievance redressal. The observations and directions of the CCPD have also been instrumental in bringing about major changes in policies viz. The National Insurance Company Limited has amended its guidelines for providing scribe to candidates with disabilities (VH), KVPY has decided to include empowerment initiative for persons with disabilities from 2013 onwards, Kendriya Vidhyalaya Sanghathan amended its admission guidelines, Department of Personnel & Training has amended the format of disability certificate, Ministry of Health & Family Welfare amended the definition of family by including the dependent disabled brother in the definition of family without any age limit.
- 4.1.5 Office of the CCPD since its inception in October 1998 till 31.03.2022 took up 27875 matters (excluding matters taken up in Mobile Courts) either on its own initiative or on the basis of complaints/representations received in the office. In the year 2021-22, 488 cases were registered as new cases including of Mobile Courts/ Review Meetings. In addition to the fresh cases registered during 2021-22, 258 pending matters from previous years were also carried forward for taking appropriate action.
- 4.1.6 Online Hearings: Due to Covid prevalence in the country for the first time all cases were heard and disposed of online through video conferencing. In the year 2021-2022, 336 cases were disposed of online. The work of CCPD office was not stalled despite adverse circumstances in comparison to other Courts.

CHAPTER 8

AWARENESS WORKSHOP TO CREATE AWARENESS ABOUT CENTRAL GOVERNMENT SCHEMES/PROGRAMMES AND IMPLEMENTATION OF RPwD ACT, 2016

Office of Chief Commissioner for Persons with Disabilities (CCPD) and DEPwD conducted 02 days sensitization workshop in Kevadia, Gujarat 4-5th March, 2022 with the Secretaries and Commissioners for Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) of States/UTs to create awareness about Central Government Schemes/Programmes and Implementation of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016.

RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE CHIEF COMMISSIONER FOR PERSONS WITH DISABILITIES

1. **REPLY FILING** – Some establishments either do not file Reply at all or do not file Reply within prescribed time. Hence some rule may be made either using rule making powers or through amendment in Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 to punish the establishments who are not filing Reply.
2. **EQUAL OPPORTUNITY POLICY** – In course of Complaint Redressal Mechanism it is observed that appropriate provisions relating to transfer, as prescribed in DoPT O.Ms. are not included in Equal Opportunity Policies framed by the establishments. Similarly, many establishments avoid providing post-recruitment and pre-promotion trainings. Hence, Rule 8 of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Rules, 2017 can be made more stringent or any other step may be taken to ensure effective implementation of Rule 8.
3. **UNFILLED VACANCIES AND REASONABLE ACCOMMODATION** – The most common complaint relating to recruitment is that on many occasions vacancies reserved for Divyangjan are declared ‘unfilled’ because of ‘No one found suitable’ reason. Establishments do not adopt and apply principles of Reasonable Accommodation which is already enshrined in Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016. Necessary steps may be taken to ensure that establishments adopt Reasonable Accommodation and relax the standards in order to provide opportunities to divyang candidates.
4. **LIST OF POSTS IDENTIFIED SUITABLE FOR DIVYANGJAN** – Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities issued list of posts identified suitable for Divyangjan on 04.01.2021. However, it is observed that there is huge difference between the nomenclature of posts used by the establishments and nomenclature of posts as mentioned in the list. This loophole is used by the establishments to avoid implementation of the list. Hence, it is important to ensure that all the establishments are bound to inform Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities about the nomenclature of posts used by such establishments.
5. Rights of Persons with Disabilities, Act, 2016 being a Central Act, working and functioning of the office of the State Commissioner should be uniform throughout the country. There should be a standard administrative structure of office of State Commissioner of all States in the country. Its size and number of officials may vary depending upon the size and need of the State. Office of CCPD will help in developing a standardized common protocol for functioning of State Commissioners.
6. The procedure of taking up complaints/grievances of persons with disabilities and the manner of their disposal should also be uniform. All offices of State Commissioner should follow/adopt the procedure prescribed under Rule 38 of RPwD Rules, 2017. The format of notices or summons, requisitions and issuance of commission for examination of witness or documents should be uniform in all States.
7. A Whatsapp group of State Commissioners should be generated, whose group admin should be either CCPD or his sub-ordinate officer, so that the best practices and remarkable judgments could be shared.
8. A One- day workshop of State Commissioner may be convened by the Office of CCPD to develop a uniform format for notices, summons, requisitions and issuance of commission for examination of witness or documents.

9. The State Commissioners need to take proactive role in ensuring implementation Accessible India Campaign in association with the concerned Department of State Government.
10. The State Commissioners in association with General Administration Department and Department dealing with empowerment of PwDs of the States/UTs may take steps to ensure implementation of the provision of reservation for PwDs and maintain data of employees with disabilities in State Government/ UT Administration establishments;
11. There is a greater need for liaison on the part of State Commissioners with all State Departments and for holding sensitizing workshops about rights and entitlements of PwDs and protection available under RPwD Act, 2016.
12. The State Commissioners need to take steps to popularize the schemes and programmes of the Central and State Government for empowerment of PwDs and also the Early Intervention Centres being set up at seven National Institutes and seven Composite Regional Centres.

A. National Handicapped Finance and Development Corporation

National Handicapped Finance and Development Corporation (NHFDC) has been set up by the Ministry of Social Justice & Empowerment, Government of India on 24th January 1997. The company is registered under Section 25 of the Companies Act, 1956 as a Company not for profit.

It is wholly owned by Government of India and has an authorized share capital of Rs. 400 Crores (Rupees Four Hundred Crores only). The company is managed by Board of Directors nominated by Government of India. NHFDC functions as an apex institution for channelizing the funds to persons with disabilities through the State Channelizing Agencies (SCAs) nominated by the State Government(s).

Aims & Objectives

- Ali Yavar Jung National Institute of Speech and Hearing Disabilities (Divyangjan) (AYJNISHD) was established on 9th August, 1983. It is an autonomous organisation under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, New Delhi. The Institute is located at Bandra (West), Mumbai.

5. **National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities (Divyangjan)**

The National Institute for the Empowerment of Persons with Visual Disabilities owes its origin to St. Dunstan's Hostel for the War Blinded established in 1943, which offered a basic set of rehabilitation services to the soldiers and sailors blinded in the World War II. In 1950, the Government of India took over the St. Dunstan's Hostel and entrusted the Ministry of Education with the responsibility of developing comprehensive services for the rehabilitation of blind persons. Subsequently, services for the blind witnessed remarkable expansion. In the same year, the Government established the Training Centre for the Adult Blind to ensure reintegration

of blind soldiers including other persons in the world of work. In 1951, the Government established Central Braille Press; in 1952, Workshop for the manufacturing of Braille Appliances; in 1954, Sheltered Workshop; in 1975 Training Centre for the Adult Blind Women and in 1959, Model School for the Visually Handicapped. In 1963, National Library for the Print Handicapped was established out of which National Talking Book Library was carved out in the year 1990. On integration of all the Units in 1967, the Government established National Centre for the Blind (NCB). This Centre was further upgraded as National Institute for the Visually Handicapped in the year 1979 and finally in October 1982, it was registered under the Societies Registration Act, 1860 and gained the status of an Autonomous Body.

The NIEPVD has its Headquarters at 116, Rajpur Road, Dehradun with one Regional Centre at Chennai (Tamil Nadu) established in 1988 and two Regional Chapters at Kolkata (W.B.) and Secunderabad (Andhra Pradesh) established in the year 1997. These Chapters provide peripheral services and are being served by a small component of Officers and Staff transferred from the Headquarters, whereas, Regional Centre at Chennai is a full-fledged Institute with staff strength of 30 headed by a Regional Director. The Institute also coordinates and supervises Composite Regional Centre for Persons with Disabilities, Sundernagar (H.P.) established in the year 2001.

Objectives

- To conduct, sponsor, co-ordinate and/or subsidize research in collaboration with other NGOs and research organizations including Universities into various dimensions of the education and rehabilitation of the visually impaired.
- To undertake, sponsor, co-ordinate or subsidise research into biomedical engineering leading to the effective evaluation of special appliances/instruments or suitable surgical or medical procedures or the development of new special appliances/instruments.
- To undertake or sponsor the training of trainees and various specialized professionals including Teachers, Employment Officers, Psychologists, Vocational Counsellors and such other personnel as deemed necessary.
- To distribute, promote, or subsidise the manufacture of prototypes and to manage distribution of any or all devices designed to promote any aspect of the education, rehabilitation or employment of the Visually Impaired.

9 Indian Sign Language Research and Training Centre (ISLRTC)

In the 2000s, the Indian deaf community advocated for an institute focused on ISL teaching and research. The 11th Five Year Plan (2007-2012) acknowledged that the needs of people with hearing disabilities had been relatively neglected and envisaged the development of a sign language research and training center, to promote and develop sign language and training of teachers and interpreters. The Finance Minister announced the setting up of ISLRTC in the Union Budget speech of 2010-11.

As a result, in 2011, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment approved the establishment of the Indian Sign Language Research and Training Center (ISLRTC) as an autonomous centre of the Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU), Delhi. The foundation stone of the centre was laid at IGNOU campus on 4th October, 2011. In 2013, the centre at IGNOU was closed.

In an order dated 20th April, 2015, the Ministry decided to integrate ISLRTC with the regional centre of the Ali Yavar Jung National Institute of Hearing Handicapped (AYJNIHH) at Delhi. However, the Deaf community protested this decision due to the different perspectives and goals of ISLRTC and AYJNIHH.

The protests and meetings with the Ministers resulted in the Union Cabinet approving the setting up of ISLRTC as a Society under the Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities, MSJE, in a meeting held on 22nd September, 2015. An order to this effect was issued by the MSJE on 28th September, 2015, leading to the establishment of ISLRTC.

As per the 2011 Census, the total population of deaf persons in India numbered about 50 lakh. The needs of the deaf community have long been ignored and the problems have been documented by various organizations working for the deaf. Obsolete training methodology and teaching systems need urgent attention.

Indian Sign Language (ISL) is used in the deaf community all over India. But ISL is not used in deaf schools to teach deaf children. Teacher training programs do not orient teachers towards teaching methods that use ISL. There is no teaching material that incorporates sign language. Parents of deaf children are not aware about sign language and its ability to remove communication barriers. ISL interpreters are an urgent requirement at institutes and places where communication between deaf and hearing people takes place but India has only less than 300 certified interpreters.

Therefore, an institute that met all these needs was a necessity. After a long struggle by the deaf community, the Ministry approved the establishment of ISLRTC at New Delhi on 28th September, 2015.

Vision: To build an inclusive society in which equal opportunities are provided for the growth and development of Persons with Disabilities so that they can lead productive, safe and dignified lives.

Mission: To empower Persons with Disabilities, through its various Acts/Institutions/Organizations and Schemes for rehabilitation and to create an enabling environment that provides such persons with equal opportunities, protection of their rights and enables them to participate as independent and productive members of society.

Objective:

1. To develop manpower for using Indian Sign Language (ISL) and teaching and conducting research in ISL, including bilingualism.
2. To promote the use of Indian Sign Language as educational mode for deaf students at primary, secondary and higher education levels.
3. To carry out research through collaboration with universities and other educational institution in India and abroad and create linguistic records/ analyses of the Indian Sign Language, including creation of Indian Sign Language corpus (Vocabulary).
4. To orient and train various groups, i.e. Govt. officials, teachers, professionals, community leaders and the public at large for understanding and using Indian Sign Language.
5. To collaborate with organizations of the deaf and other institutions in the field of disability to promote and propagate Indian Sign Language.
6. To collect information relating to Sign Language used in other parts of the world so that this input can be used to upgrade the Indian Sign Language.

POSTS IDENTIFIED AS SUITABLE FOR VARIOUS CATEGORIES OF DISABILITIES.

MINISTRY OF SOCIAL JUSTICE AND EMPOWERMENT [Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities (Divyangjan)] NOTIFICATION

New Delhi, the 4th January, 2021

No. 38-16/2020-DD-III.—Whereas Section 33 of the repealed Persons with Disabilities (Equal Opportunities, Protection of Rights and Full Participation) Act, 1995 (hereinafter, after referred as repealed Act) provided for reservation of not less than 3% for persons with disabilities in the three categories namely, (i) locomotor disability including cerebral palsy, (ii) visual impairment (low vision & blindness) and (iii) hearing impairment.

2. And whereas, section 32 of the repealed Act mandated the appropriate Government to identify posts to be reserved for persons with disabilities and review such list at periodic interval not exceeding three years.
3. And whereas, in pursuance of the above provisions of the repealed Act, the Central Government last notified the list of posts suitable for persons with disabilities through notification No. 16-15/2010-DD-III dated 29th July, 2013.
4. And whereas, the Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, in pursuance of the provisions of sections 32 and 33 of the repealed Act (since repealed on 15.06.2017) had constituted an Expert Committee on the 19th November, 2015 under the chairpersonship of the Secretary, Department of Empowerment of Persons with Disabilities to review the list of Central Government posts identified suitable for Persons with Disabilities.
5. And whereas, the Expert Committee met on the 9th December, 2015 and decided that one Sub-Committee should be constituted for each of the category of disabilities which are provided reservation under section 33 of the said repealed Act and accordingly, following three Sub-Committees were constituted, namely:—
 - i. Sub-Committee for locomotor disability
 - ii. Sub-Committee for hearing impaired
 - iii. Sub-Committee for visually impaired
6. And whereas, the Central Government notified the Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 (hereinafter referred as “the Act”) which inter-alia under sub-section (1) of section 34 extended the benefit of reservation to persons with benchmark disabilities in the new category of (i) autism, specific learning disability, mental illness and intellectual disabilities and (ii) multiple disabilities amongst the various categories mentioned in the said section of the Act.
7. And whereas, Section 33 of the said Act mandates the appropriate Government to constitute expert committee for identification of posts suitable for persons with benchmark disabilities and accordingly, following two sub-committees were further constituted to take care of identification of posts suitable for new categories included under the Act, namely; (i) Sub-Committee for autism, intellectual disabilities, specific learning disability and mental illness, and (ii) Sub-Committee for multiple disabilities.
8. And whereas, all the Sub-Committees reviewed the posts notified through notification No.16-15/2010-DD-III dated the 29th July 2013, and submitted their reports and the Expert Committee considered the reports of the

Sub-Committees in its meeting held on 19th November 2019, finalized its recommendations and submitted its report to the Central Government for consideration.

9. Now, therefore, in exercise of powers conferred upon section 33 of the said Act and based on the recommendations of the Expert Committee, the Central Government hereby notifies the gist of the report, and the list of Central Government posts in Group A, B, C and D identified suitable for persons with benchmark disabilities which is at Annexure-A for information and further necessary action by all cadre controlling authorities in the Central Government.
10. The said list supersedes the list of posts for Groups 'A', 'B', 'C' and 'D' notified through notification No. 16-15/2010-DD-III dated 29th July, 2013.

Note 1: Persons with benchmark disabilities require aids and assistive devices to overcome their difficulties. The aids and assistive devices may be provided to persons with benchmark disabilities on their appointment keeping in view their requirement as per the instructions of DoPT issued from time to time.

Note 2: The list of posts being notified is only indicative and not an exhaustive list. If a post is not mentioned in the list, it is not to be construed that it has been exempted. Central Ministries, Departments, Autonomous Bodies, Public Sector Undertakings may further supplement the list by adding to the list of posts identified for respective category of disability.

Note 3: If a post is already held by a person with benchmark disability, it shall be deemed to have been identified for that category of benchmark disability.

Note 4: If a post is identified in the feeder grade, all the posts in the promotional grade should also stand identified.

Note 5: If a post having identical nature and place of job with respect to any identified post, the post should be construed to be identified even if the post has a different nomenclature and/or is placed in a different group.

Note 6: This list will be the principal list in respect of the posts identified suitable for persons with benchmark disabilities. However, in case a list of post is separately identified by any Central Government establishment, the list having wider range of identified categories (i.e. having more sub-categories under each category) would prevail.

Note 7: In case a post is identified suitable for more than one sub-category under a broad category, individual Central Ministries or Departments or Public Sector Undertakings or Autonomous Bodies should conduct recruitment for all the sub-categories and cannot suo-moto choose one particular sub-category for appointment.

Note 8: It is for the Central Ministries or Departments or Public Sector Undertakings or Autonomous Bodies to verify the authenticity of the certificate of disability and examine suitability of the candidate in terms of functional requirements before appointment against any identified post.

Note 9: In the event of discrepancies in the English and Hindi versions of this Notification, English version shall prevail over the Hindi version.
